### Chapter 2

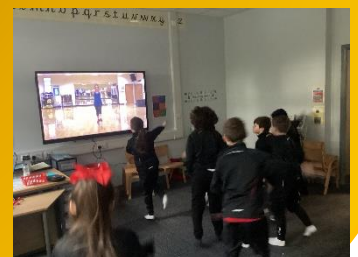

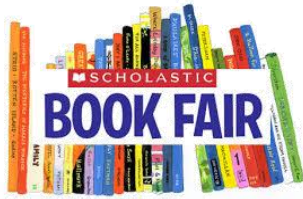


## Sports Report
