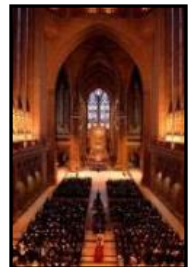
**There will be no lessons on this day**

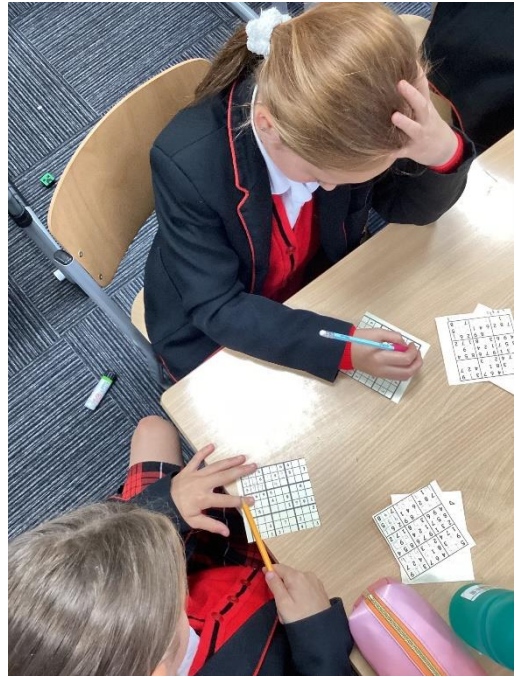
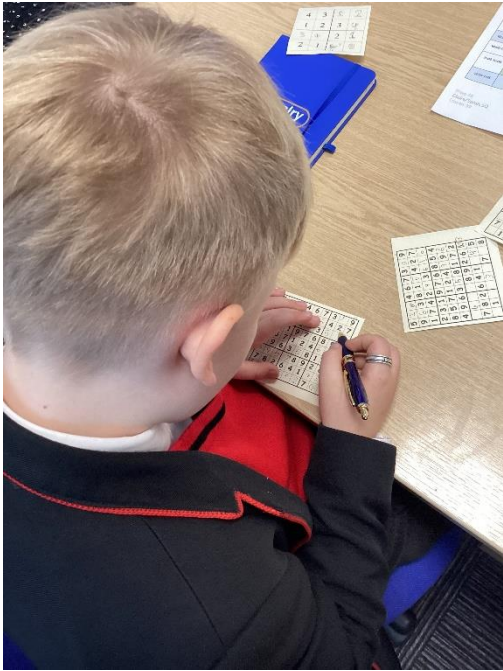
## Whole School
