Careers has been a big theme this week. There was the career Chapter 11 interview day where our pupils were helped to develop individual interview techniques by a large group of volunteers from every conceivable professional background, as Mrs Doran describes:

This week we were delighted to invite almost forty employers into Liverpool College to conduct a series of one-to-one interviews for every one of our Chapter 11 pupils. The event was organised in a round robin format, with every pupil receiving six interviews, each of between five to eight minutes long. Each interview was followed by feedback to allow the pupils to perfect and enhance their answers, building confidence as the event progressed.

The interviewers came from a wide and varied field of careers, ranging from doctors, engineers, teachers, dentists, construction specialists, solicitors, HR, accountancy, research and a wide variety of business backgrounds. The pupils all benefited greatly from their expertise and advice. The event was arranged by Mrs Doran and Mrs Drew, with assistance from four wonderful sixth form students: Demi A, Tahlia R, Omar K and Lily N.

A day later we received a glowing report from our assessor for the Quality in Careers Standard National Quality Award detailing how the College meets very well the benchmarks for excellent careers education.

I see this especially in the Prep and Pre Prep with groups of pupils making the most of the playing fields and forest school, the sound of intense and friendly competition and the glories of our campus bathed in sunshine.

By equipping our pupils with the necessary tools to navigate through stressful periods, we aim to foster a supportive environment where mental well-being is prioritised alongside academic success.


