Bursaries and Scholarships Discounts and Remissions

The following policies are prospective. They apply to all applicants seeking admission for September 2009 and beyond.

Sibling Discounts : An automatic discount of 25% for the third child in a family. All other discounts to be based on the parent bursary application form and will be bursaries, not automatic discounts.

Scholarships : Students are expected to play a full part in the life of the school, to be diligent in their studies, and to set an example in their conduct and behaviour. Scholarship honours may be revoked if the Principal feels that the student's action or inaction have brought disrepute to the name of the scholarship.

Prep School Academic Scholarships

The Godwyn House Scholarship

This is awarded to pupils at the end of Year 2 in the Pre Prep and who are transferring to the Prep School. It is awarded to the top three pupils, based on NFER scores and academic performance during the year. Pupils will receive a medal, a £100 book token and their names will be placed on the Honours Board. Further financial assistance would be need- based and would come in the form of a bursary.

Prep School Scholarships

Prep School Scholarships are awarded to pupils who perform well during the entrance assessments ie scoring 120 or more in two of the 3 NFER assessments. Pupils will receive a medal, a £100 book token and their names will be placed on the Honours Board. Further financial assistance would be need- based and would come in the form of a bursary.

Prep School Bursaries

Bursaries are need based. They are awarded annually on the basis of the Parent Bursary Application. They can vary in amount from 10%-100% of fees.

Applications for bursaries must be made at the time of application in the case of prospective students and before Feb 1, in the case of returning students.

A committee of the Governors and Staff will award and review bursaries.

Students receiving a bursary must make satisfactory academic progress and must have an excellent conduct and behaviour record in order to be considered for renewal.

Upper School Academic Scholarships

- **Year 7-11 : The Derby Scholarship**

Scholarships are awarded to the top 10 performers on the entrance examination. If students accept the place, they receive a medal, a £100 book token and their names will be placed on the Honours Board. Further financial assistance would be need- based and would come in the form of a bursary.

- **Sixth Form :**

The Gladstone Scholarship

Any student who achieves straight As and A* on their GCSE will be awarded an annual £1500 scholarship if they continue for the next two years in the sixth Form.

The Christine Bradley Memorial Scholarship for Chemistry

An annual scholarship of £1000 awarded to a student who has excelled in Science at GCSE and studying Chemistry in the Sixth Form.

The Chris McNally Memorial Scholarship for Economics

An annual scholarship of £1000 awarded to a student who achieved outstanding GCSE results and is studying Economics in the Sixth Form.

Upper School Music Scholarships

- **Year 7 – 11**

Two music scholarships are awarded based on auditions. Recipients are entered on the honour board and receive one free music lesson per week during term time. The scholarships are reviewed by the Director of Music. Recipients are expected to have exemplary behaviour and participate actively in the musical life of the school.

- **Sixth Form**

Two exceptional musicians are offered £1500 annual scholarships for Sixth Form study after audition.

Upper School Drama Scholarships

- **Year 7-11 : The Harrison Scholarship**

Two students are selected based on auditions. Winners receive a medal, and a £100 book token. Their names are entered on the Honours Board. Further financial assistance would be need based and would come in the form of a bursary.

- **Sixth Form**

Two exceptional drama students annually will be awarded an annual £1500 drama scholarship based on audition and commitment to drama during their time at school.

Upper School Art Scholarships

- **Year 7-11 : The Halliday Scholarship**

Two students are awarded the scholarship based on portfolio work and interview. They receive a medal, and a £100 book token. Their names are entered on the Honours Board. Further financial assistance would be need- based and would come in the form of a bursary.

- **Sixth Form**

Two students will be awarded an annual £1500 scholarship based upon their performance in art and their commitment to art in the school.

Upper School Sport Scholarships

- **Year 10 -11 : The Kenneth Cranston Scholarship**

Two students will be awarded £1500 scholarships for their excellent performance in multiple sports and their dedication to College sport.

- **Sixth Form**

Students who have reached national representative level in a sport played competitively by the College will receive a 50% scholarship and will be expected to participate fully in the sports programme of the College.

Students who have achieved North of England honours in a sport played competitively by the College will receive a £1500 scholarship.

Upper School Bursaries

Bursaries are need based. They are awarded annually on the basis of the Parent Bursary Application. They can vary in amount from 10%-100% of fees.

Applications for bursaries must be made at the time of application in the case of prospective students and before Feb 1, in the case of returning students.
