



School Uniform reminder



All pupils must have the correct school uniform; full details are available on the school website.

Please ensure that your child has a school coat with the school logo. Pupils who wear the 'C' uniform must have the correct shirt with the reverse collar.

All pupils must wear school shoes not trainers except for games day.

Please be aware that staff will ask your child why they are not in the correct uniform.

Please ensure that ALL uniform and PE kit is named as we already have a ridiculous amount of brand new uniform that we have no way of knowing who the owners are! There are 279 pupils in our school and it is impossible to track down un-named uniform/kit. This includes shoes/trainers/pumps/boot bags.

After parent consultation on Games Day pupils are to wear full tracksuit (no blazer required) with either polo shirt or rugby top underneath whichever is most comfortable.

All pupils in Years 1-11 will be required to wear a house cord on their blazer pocket. The College will provide these for your child and they been issued to all children today.
