It was the second round of the National Vase, and the boys knew they had a tough game ahead of them.

An unorganized start to the game meant St Anselm's scored a quick try, giving them a 7-0 advantage. The try was soon followed by a penalty kick from distance, increasing the lead to 10-0. The lead gave the lads a wake-up call, and the intensity of the game increased tremendously. St Anselm's were put under a lot of pressure, however a knock-on caused the first half to come to an end.

The score was now 19-16 to the college, with 10 minutes left to play. However, a penalty being awarded to St Anselm's, meant they were one again able to kick the ball over the posts, for another 3 points. The college made sure to respond to this, and instantly attacked in the opposition half. After around 20 fazes of forward balls, Paddy S placed the ball on the line, but

the try was disallowed for double movement, therefore ending the game at 19-19. St Anselm's went through to the next round on the away rule.
