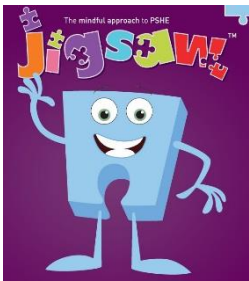

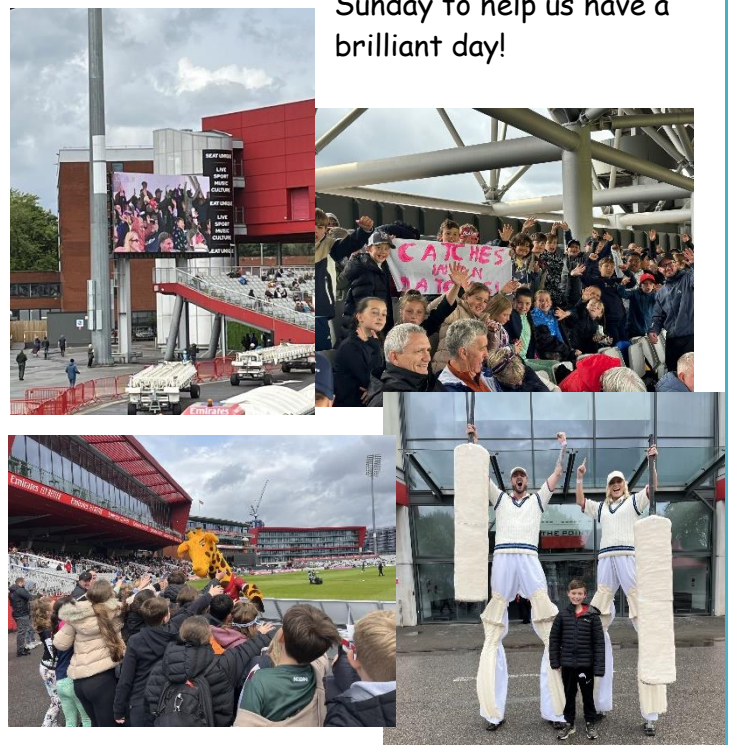
Year 5 Football
