Advance notice of early school finish time on Friday 23rd May 2025

As you may already be aware, on Friday 23rd May 2025, Sefton Park will be hosting Radio 1's Big Weekend event.

We have been informed by Liverpool City Council that this is going to cause a considerable amount of disruption, particularly with road closures around Sefton Park and with the anticipated numbers of visitors travelling to the event in the afternoon.

Therefore, following careful consideration we have made the decision that school will finish early at **12pm (midday) on Friday 23rd May** to ensure that pupils can get home safely and to minimise disruption.

Summer uniform

With the warmer weather, pupils in Reception can wear black shorts or tracksuit bottoms. Please note no leggings or cycling shorts.

From Y 1-6 pupils should come into school in the L or C uniform (not a mixture of both). Please note in summer the trousers can be swapped for grey shorts.

On field uniform days, pupils should come in wearing their tracksuit and bring shorts or a skort into school to change into. No leggings or cycling shorts should be worn.

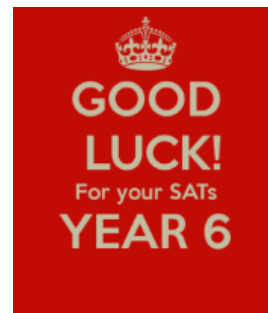


Get your running shoes Primary, we are taking part in the North West Cancer Research Fun Run on Wednesday 21st May.

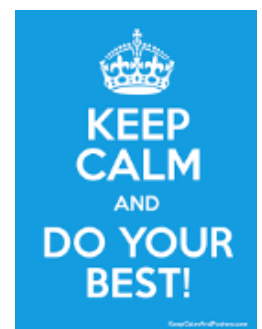
Please bring in any money raised on the day of the race in a sealed envelope with the amount clearly written on the front.

Organ Extravaganza: A Night at the Movies –

On Tuesday, the Music Department hosted its annual organ and brass concert: Organ Extravaganza: A Night at the Movies! It was a superb concert performed by both the brass, woodwind, string and percussion ensemble, directed by Leo B (Ch12) and a couple of external visiting organists, which include Myles Tyrell, organist of Ullet Road Church, Ed Carew, organ scholar of Liverpool Anglican Cathedral and former Director of Music: Tim Harvey. All musicians performed some incredible music from some of your favourite movies!

We kicked off at 7pm, with a trumpet and organ piece, followed by the 20th Century Fox fanfare as Mr Harvey walked out to introduce and welcome the audience to the concert. Then, everything fell into place! We had stunning performances from John William's Star Wars, Superman. Morricone's Gabriel's Oboe, John Powell's 'Test Drive' from How To Train Your Dragon, Prokofiev's Dance of the Knights (from The Apprentice), Richard Bennet's Love Theme from Four Weddings and a Funeral, Bernstein's The Magnificent Seven theme, Rodgers & Hammerstein's Edelweiss from the Sound of Music, plus two organ pieces wonderfully performed by two students James K (Ch9) and Adam S (Ch11).

Huge praise must go to Maria B (Ch8), who performed an incredible and beautiful solo performance of the Schindler's List theme!

It's been quoted as 'the best Organ Gala concert, yet!' and I'm sure that more themed concerts like this will appear in the future, so keep an eye out!
