How much screen time should my child have?

Digital screens are a part of modern life, but finding the right balance between screen time and other activities for young children can be tricky. The DfE have released guidance to limit total screen time for young children, wherever possible.

- Under 2 years: Avoid screen time other than for shared activities with family that encourage bonding, interaction and conversation.
- 2-5 years: Try to keep it to 1 hour a day. Less if possible.
