

What will you see in Business Studies lessons? Business studies is centered around the comprehension of Business Principles. This is a foundation that focuses on how businesses work and how they interact in our society. These topics include economics, finance, marketing, operations, and business strategy. Understanding these concepts will allow students to see not only how individual businesses work but also how they interact in a whole industry to drive the economy.	What are the common misconceptions that pupils have and make in Business Studies that we need to address? Many business students assume that making a profit is the sole purpose of a business. Profit is important, but it's not the only goal of business. Businesses also aim at delivering quality products/services, fostering customer relationships, and contributing to the community. Students often think of business as pure competitive combat. It is more about creating and delivering value to customers. Collaboration with other businesses can be a strategic move for growth. The purpose is not to defeat competitors, but to serve customers more effectively.	What will you see in pupils' Business Studies books? Comprehensive lesson notes and evidence of live marking used as a starter activity to reinforce previous work, and students record their marks on the work. All work is kept in folders, regularly checked. Whole class verbal feedback is provided and expected to be written down.
What assessment (formative and summative) methods do we use in Business Studies? Formally assessed work each week, that will be marked and used for feedback and progress. Whole class verbal feedback is provided and expected to be written down. Live marking is often used as a starter activity- usually to reinforce previous work, and students record their marks on the work. Marks from this are sometimes noted down. Exam style questions are used more frequently to develop exam technique.
