Dear Parents,

During our time away, we all received some marvellous news. Ms Latham, our head of boarding, gave birth to a healthy baby girl, Elsie. Elsie lives with her brother and with her parents on the campus of Liverpool College. We shall have to consult the archives to see if any child was born on the LC campus, or spent the first days of life before this moment. Her birth is likely to be a historic first. This is the sort of question the Lerpoolian website is usually able to answer.

Our half term has begun in typically strenuous fashion.

This is the part of the year when we all begin to focus relentlessly on the high stakes exam season now just months away. The Chapter 11 pupils who received their mock results at the end of last half term were in many cases sobered by what their envelope contained. There is much strategizing going on among teachers and pupils about exam entries, about interventions and additional tuition, about how to make sure that 11 years of formal education bears total fruit in the 12th year.

The same spirit pervades options evening, that moment when Chapter 9 pupils and their parents begin to make educational choices having been fed a set staple for the first 10 years of formal education. It is always exciting to eavesdrop on these conversations about what pupils are motivated to pursue and where their passion and orientations are taking them.

The Open Book afternoon in primary phase took place at the same time. Carers, parents and grandparents had a chance to come in to the school and review their child's books with teachers. This seems to me to be one of the best ways of "reporting" progress as it leads to fruitful educational discussion about progress and obstacles to progress and helps parents to support their child. I was impressed with the pride with which pupils showed off their work.

Carys E and Tahlia R (Ch12) have reported on the Spanish trip that took place in half term:

During our trip to Spain, we visited many beautiful and culturally rich parts of the region of Andalucía. A particular favourite experience of ours was visiting La Alhambra in Granada, which is an exquisite palace of Islamic architecture, containing delicate Arabic carvings and stunning views over the city of Granada. The gardens and many flowers of 'el Generalife' were incredible, and the history explained by the tour guide was very interesting. Visiting a town called Ronda, one which is famous for its bullfighting history, was also very useful as it directly links to what we are learning at A-Level, and visiting The Alcazaba of Málaga, with its ancient architecture, was fascinating. Overall, the trip gave us a better understanding and appreciation for Spanish culture, as well as showing us how vastly diverse and unique the different parts of Andalucía are, despite there only being a short distance between them. We are incredibly thankful to our teachers for giving us this opportunity to learn about the culture, try the local cuisine and practice the language.



Reports about the Greece and Spain trips have been uniformly positive. Teachers have commented on the slew of compliments they received while perambulating hotels and tourist sites. Some hotel staff could not, apparently, believe this was a school trip as the behaviour and attitude of our pupils was so good. My gratitude to all the staff who were willing to take a half term holiday and lead a trip.

Currently, the Chapter 4 trip to Barnstondale is enjoying some sort of sunshine among the showers. This is that first experience of the LC overnight, extended stay adventure learning which is a hallmark of going to school here. If the past is a guide, they will return simultaneously elated and exhausted.
