Workshop Details:

Mother Tongue Game Workshop

Date: Thursday, 10th October, 1:30-3:00 PM

This workshop will guide participants through a unique game where they create poems combining languages from Black cultures. It encourages students to connect with their roots and express themselves through language.

Inspired Art Workshop

Date: Thursday, 24th October, 1:30-3:00 PM

This session will use the poems created in the previous workshop as inspiration for participants to create artwork, providing a space for creative freedom and expression.

Both workshops will take place in the Student Life Building, Copperas Hill, Liverpool, L3 5AJ (SLB/Room 3.04), providing an engaging, hands-on environment for students to celebrate and explore cultural narratives. At the end of the sessions, participants will have the opportunity to showcase their poems and artwork at our Diversity and Inclusion event.
