Mission

Learning a musical instrument can help support your child's development as well as provide a social and interactive avenue to explore creativity.

Children who learn musical instruments develop skills as well as address vital social skills such as resilience, self-confidence and communication.

Children thrive in lessons when they can see progress and are given opportunities to make music together.

In Liverpool College Primary Phase, we endeavour to ensure your child picks the right instrument for them as well offering instrumental pathways which are age appropriate and most likely to ensure retention and enjoyment.

The relationship between adult, child, practice and outcome is vital and as a result, as part of your child's instrumental package there will be opportunities for you to attend sessions designed to help you support practice, reaffirm language used by our specialist teachers and encourage your child in their learning. Lessons are primarily individual 1:1 lesson, with opportunities to perform together in assemblies and other settings to celebrate talents.

The relaunch of this programme is designed to connect child, teacher and adult and integrate the progress within the wider school community.

When do lessons take place?

- During the school day – either in lesson time or before/after school by arrangement with your teacher.
- When lessons take place during the school day, pupils are placed on a rotation to ensure the same academic lesson is not missed each week.
- For Chapter 2 and 6 pupils, teachers will try to avoid Maths and English lessons as much as possible.

Who will teach me?

- A highly skilled team of visiting peripatetic teachers supply instrumental lessons. Students may learn by studying for ABRSM/Trinity/Rock School Graded examinations, or purely for the joy of playing. We have numerous choirs and instrumental ensembles for you to join and put your skills to good use!



How much does it cost?

- Lessons cost £18.50 per half hour session.
- Lessons must be paid for on or before the first lesson, and for the full half-term ahead. This is to help our Peripatetic staff plan their teaching.

What do I do if I need to miss a lesson?

- Please inform your teacher at least **48 hours** in advance via the contact information they share with you – this will help them greatly with their planning.
- If absence is not reported in advance, **the teacher reserves the right to charge for that particular lesson**, as they may have travelled in specially to teach you.
- Refunds for extended illness are available and at the discretion of the teacher.

What do I do if I want to stop lessons or change instrument?

- If you wish to cease your instrumental lessons, **at least 6 weeks notice** must be given. You must contact your teacher to let them know.
- If you would like to change, speak to your teacher to let them know, give 6 weeks notice as above, then speak to a member of the Music dept. to arrange to start learning a different instrument.

The Contract

Bringing Instruments into School

- It is the responsibility of the individual pupil to ensure the safety of their instrument(s) while on the school campus. Liverpool College or the instrumental/vocal teacher cannot take responsibility for lost or damaged instruments.
- Children can store their instruments in their bag lockers in their classrooms or in the music room.

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To Cancel Your Contract

Information about the 'cooling off' period and the exercise of the right to cancel during it

- You have the right to cancel this contract within 14 days (the 'cooling off' period) without giving any reason. The cooling off period will expire after 14 days from the day of the conclusion of the contract. To exercise the right to cancel, you must inform the teacher of your decision to cancel this contract by a clear statement (e.g. by email).
- To meet the cancellation deadline, it is sufficient for you to send your communication concerning your exercise of the right to cancel before the cooling off period has expired.

Effects of cancellation during the 'cooling off' period

- If you cancel this contract during the cooling off period, the teacher will reimburse to you all payments received from you (excluding lessons given) unless you requested us to begin the performance of services during the cooling off period.
- The teacher will make the reimbursement without undue delay, and not later than 14 days after the day on which we are informed about your decision to cancel this contract.
- The teacher will make the reimbursement using the same means of payment as you used for the initial transaction, unless you have expressly agreed otherwise; in any event, you will not incur any fees as a result of the reimbursement.
- If you requested us to begin the performance of services during the cancellation period, you shall pay the teacher for the Lessons provided.

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Terms and Conditions

1. **Fees**
Lesson fees are subject to annual review in line with ISM & MU rates. Where Lesson fees are increased as a result of such a review, the Teacher shall endeavour to give the Student at least one month's notice of such increase.
2. **Missed lessons**
 - a) Any Lesson missed by the Student shall be paid for unless otherwise agreed with the Teacher. If the teacher is unavailable to give any scheduled Lesson, the Lesson will be carried forward to another date. If this is not possible, any fee already paid will be refunded or used to pay for a future Lesson.
 - b) The parent/carer/pupil must give the Teacher at least **48-hours notice** should a situation arise where a scheduled lesson cannot be given. In the event of a scheduled lesson being missed without notice, the event resulting in the lesson having to be re-scheduled.
3. **Additional lessons**
Extra Lessons may be scheduled during holiday periods or at any other time by mutual agreement and at a cost mutually agreed between the Student and the Teacher. If the Teacher is not able to provide such extra Lessons at the School, as a result of the School being closed or for any other reason, the location of such lessons shall be agreed between the Teacher and the Student.
4. **Cooling off period**
 - a) The Student has a legal right to cancel this agreement under the Consumer Contracts (Information, Cancellation and Additional Charges) Regulations 2013 during the "cooling off period" set out in 4(b) below. This means that during that cooling off period, if the Student changes his/her mind or decides for any other reason that he/she does not want to receive the Lessons, the Student can notify the Teacher of his/her decision to cancel the agreement and receive a refund for any Lessons paid for but not received prior to that cancellation.
 - b) The Student's cooling off period starts from the date of this agreement and ends 14 days later. To cancel the agreement the Student should let the Teacher know that he/she has decided to cancel.
5. **Lesson Timetable**
 - a) Lessons will be timetabled on a rota system to ensure the pupil does not miss the same lesson on a regular basis.
 - b) The pupil will be expected to adhere to the times set by their teacher. It is the pupil's responsibility to ascertain the time of their lesson each week.
6. **Termination of agreement**
 - a) A decision to discontinue Lessons after the cooling off period may be taken by the Student or the Teacher in which case **written notice of 4 weeks** shall be given by the party seeking to discontinue. In the event that the Student discontinues Lessons with insufficient notice, the Student will be liable to pay fees for those Lessons not taken during the notice period.
 - b) If the School is closed or the Teacher is otherwise prevented by the School from conducting any Lesson or Lessons, the Teacher shall not be obliged to conduct any such Lesson or Lessons without liability to the Student.
7. **General**
 - a) Neither party shall be liable to the other party for any breach by the other of any of the terms and conditions herein occasioned by any act of God, war, revolution, riot, civil disturbance, strike, lock-out, flood, fire or other cause not reasonably within the control of such party.
 - b) The Student undertakes not to make photocopies of any music.
 - c) Examination entries, festivals, competitions or otherwise will only be entered if the Student and Teacher are in agreement. Any entry fees will be paid for by the Student.
 - d) The Student is responsible for the insurance of the Student's instrument.
 - e) In the interests of the Student's wellbeing whilst in the Teacher's care, the Teacher must be informed of any medical or other condition affecting the Student.
 - f) If the Student is under eighteen, the Student's parent or guardian gives permission for the Teacher to teach the Student.
8. **Practice between lessons**
It is important to note that whilst a Teacher will use his or her best endeavours to ensure the Student makes satisfactory progress, this cannot be guaranteed. In particular, careful regular practice as advised by the Teacher is a prerequisite of success on any musical instrument or in any musical endeavour.



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Online Lessons

2. Safeguarding

- 2.1 Online lessons must not be recorded by either party unless there is a prior agreement for this. If recordings are made, they must not be shared with third parties or uploaded to social media.
- 2.2 The online teaching platform must not be used by the parties for any other purpose than teaching, e.g. sharing photos or general messaging.
- 2.3 Where possible the pupil must limit their profile within the online teaching app, using settings and preferences to maximise privacy. The Teacher will commit to doing the same.
- 2.4 All communications regarding missed or cancelled lessons must be between the Parent and Teacher. Under no circumstances should the pupil contact the Teacher directly.
- 2.5 For the purposes of confidentiality and privacy all communications between the Parent and Teacher should be via email. Communication by telephone should only take place where necessary due to urgency (e.g. unavoidable last-minute cancellations).
- 2.6 Any defamatory, offensive or illegal material aired online by the Pupil, or inappropriate behaviour by the Pupil, will result in the immediate termination of the lesson. What constitutes such behaviour will be determined in the reasonable opinion of the Teacher. In this instance, the Teacher reserves the right to withdraw entirely from this agreement with immediate effect. Fees paid will not be refunded.
- 2.7 Both the Teacher and Pupil must dress appropriately for a lesson online and conduct the lesson in an appropriate location.
- 2.8 Both Teacher and Pupil should present against a neat and tidy background when using video.
