I was delighted to read Mr Stamper's report of a new series of cultural reflections in primary:





A huge thanks to Ms Alam for helping to put together the assembly, and to the children who took part - you were amazing!


Our celebration of the vast cultural heritage that is shared by pupils and students at Liverpool College continues next week with our annual **Cultural Diversity Day**.
